Thanks to all who went to the website to cast their votes for the 20-21 Board. Below are the results of the voting.





Minutes of the OCSSA Board Meeting

ZOOM Meeting held July 9th

Call to Order: John Howe. In attendance: John Howe, Devon Day, LaVaun Ward, Barb Schmit, Willie Ellis, Jerry Delmore. Gary Tennison and Larry Olson through voice and text.

Treasury Report: LaVaun
\$2,800.00 in checking account. Check in April to Mike for \$116.00 for hard to find finishing products.

Toy Program:

14-16 boxes in storage ready for mopping. The boxes are ready for members to pick up and work on at home. Jerry will leave two mops at the storage should anyone need to use them. Plenty of wheels and axels are ready to add to bodies once mopped and finished. There are around 300 vehicles that will be complete once mopped and finished.

Puzzles. Ladies group had not been meeting due to Covid-19. They are starting to become active. John has been in contact with them and will bring them puzzles ready to paint. While the ladies are busy with other projects, they should be able to complete the puzzles.

John and Larry have been tweaking the alphabet and number puzzles pattern. John reduced them to 0.85 and they are around 12". This brings them down from 14" and generates less waste. They have been making them with 1/4" BB for the letters and numbers with 1/8" backer and spacer. The results are better than expected. The cost is estimated around 3-4.00 per puzzle should we end up buying the wood. John did purchase some plywood from Bear Lumber and he was impressed with the quality of the wood. The cost was reasonable even with shipping.

New Business:

Election of Officers: Do we need a quorum to confirm June elections? It does not appear so. The results are in and there were 22 votes for each candidate. The results are:

Storage. John and Larry are going to meet. Larry is considering getting rid of old garden equipment that he has not used it in years. This would free up the larger shed for use by the club.
